#### Some personal thoughts

I attended the Conference to present the outcomes of my research funded under the Singa scholarship programme of IASSID. My research was entitled "Experiences of young adults with disabilities in transition in Malaysia: Listening to parents". The abstract (appended) is published on p. 142, *Journal of Policy and Practice in Intellectual Disabilities*, Vol. 10, No. 2, June 2013. I am currently following up the outcomes of my research with families who participated in the research to explore future of services for their young adults.

The Conference closing address was delivered by IASSID President Prof. Vianne Timmons. Her talk was deeply inspiring, challenging academia to effectively translate the outcomes of research into practical realities that will make a difference in the lives of the subjects involved in the research (see Timmons (2013), IASSID: Are we practicing knowledge translation effectively? *Journal of Policy and Practice in Intellectual Disabilities*, Vol. 10, No. 2).

#### **Exploring future collaborations with IASSID**

- Prof. Roy McConkey enquired about the work of NECIC and how it is doing. He has
  expressed willingness to drop by Malaysia (on his way to Australia) to conduct sessions /
  workshops of interest to NECIC. This will likely be after our 5<sup>th</sup> NECIC Ipoh, sometime in
  October 2014.
- Prof. Roy Brown, Director of IASSID Academy, emailed me today to say that the IASSID symposium in Singapore (originally slotted for 2014) has been moved to 16-17 Mar 2015. Roy works closely with Prof. Kenneth Poon of Singapore. Both met with me to express their willingness to hold sessions which may be of interest and benefit to NECIC Malaysia.
