General Information about Sibu!



Sibu, located in the heart of Sarawak on the island of Borneo, is the largest town along the mighty Rejang River, the longest river in Malaysia. Sibu is a multiracial town with a mix of Chinese, Iban, Melanau, Malay and other Sarawak indigenous peoples endowing it with a rich culture and varied local cuisine. Among the interesting landmarks in Sibu are Wisma Sanyan, a 28-storey shopping-cum-office complex and Sarawak's largest wet market. A few well established museums in the town display Sibu's history, including ethnic collections. The Lau King Howe Hospital Memorial Museum is a medical museum, the first of its kind in Malaysia.









Important Information

- Official Language: English, unless otherwise specified. Please email or call us if you need assistance with language during the conference. 如果您在大会期间需要翻译或语言协助、请尽早电邮或致电联络我们。 Sila emel atau hubungi kami secepat mungkin jika anda perlu bantuan bahasa semasa konferens.
- Group registration: 10% discount for group registration (6 or more international delegates).
- Child care service: free for registered children, during the main conference period only.
- Banks: Banks are open every weekday (9am-4pm), and ATMs are common in Sibu town, where the banks are.
- Currency: The unit of currency is the Ringgit (RM). US dollars and euros are easily changed at exchange bureaus, available at International Airports (Kuala Lumpur, Kuching and Kota Kinabalu) and Sibutown
- Credit cards: Most hotels, car-rental, shops and restaurants accept Visa and MasterCard; Amex and Diner's are not as widely accepted. Budget hostels and hotels, and basic eateries usually accept cash
- Climate: In June, Sarawak is quite dry. Average temperature ranges between 25-32°C.
- Time zone: Malaysia is eight hours ahead of Greenwich Mean Time and shares the same time zone as Singapore, Brunei Darussalam, Hong Kong, Beijing, Taipei and Perth.
- Sibu Airport: 24 KM away from the town and Kingwood Hotel. Taxi is available but they accept ringgit only. NECIC Organiser's reception counter operates between 10 am on 6th June and 1 pm on 7th June 2012.
- Liability: The organisers accept no liability for personal injuries sustained, or for loss of or damage to property belonging to delegates, incurred either during or as a result of the conference.
